The National Indian Brotherhood (NIB) Trust Fund today launched a call for applications to support education programs aimed at healing and reconciliation. Applications will be accepted from First Nation and Metis individuals.

All First Nations and Métis Citizens over the age of 18 and with a valid social insurance number are eligible for funding through a competitive application process. Preference will be given to former students of residential schools and their family members.

Funds will be dispersed to successful Individual applicants by way of:

- **Scholarship (Post-Secondary)**
Scholarships are money awards you receive for post-secondary education studies (i.e. University and College level studies).
- **Bursary (Training/Certification)**
Bursaries are money awards you receive for certificate programs and training from non-post-secondary institutions (i.e. Nechi Institute, AFOA, or other non-post-secondary institution).
- **Award (Cultural/ Traditional/ Language Knowledge building)**
Awards are set dollar amounts for individuals who wish to pursue cultural or traditional knowledge building. This could include learning a language or skill from an elder or expert, learning from traditional ceremonies, or acquiring land-based skills, etc.

The NIB Trust Fund allocates funds in accordance with the Indian Residential Schools Settlement Agreement of 2007 – the largest settlement agreement in Canadian history which provided compensation to survivors for their experiences at residential school. Funds are available to First Nation and Métis individuals, governments and organizations as part of healing and reconciliation efforts.
