CHIPPEWAS OF KETTLE & STONY POINT FIRST NATION HOSTING A GROUND-BREAKING CEREMONY FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A COMMUNITY WATER TOWER

ADMINISTRATION OFFICE, Chippewas of Kettle and Stony Point First Nation (July 9, 2018) – The Chippewas of Kettle and Stony Point First Nation will be hosting a ground-breaking ceremony for the water tower that will support the existing water system infrastructure.

The construction of the water tower is part of the ongoing developments that Chief and Council identified as a priority for the community health and safety needs of the Kettle and Stony Point First Nation. Indigenous Services Canada (ISC) has provided the capital funding for the project including the lift station required to support the system.

Media are invited to attend the ground-breaking ceremony at the site of the future water tower.

It has two land bases, one of which was the focus of a 74 year long land dispute that has had lasting implications on the local residents and their families. Despite the challenges, the Chippewas of Kettle and Stony Point have been effective in pursuing its economic growth.
