The health of all community members is the top priority for chief and council, and we are working hard to limit the spread of the COVID- 19 (Coronavirus) into our community.

The World Health Organization declared coronavirus (COVID19) a global pandemic. We want to assure community members that we are working closely with health experts, including our partners at the Health Centre, Lambton Public Health and Indigenous Services Canada to monitor and respond to this outbreak.

Coronavirus symptoms can be mild or severe and include:

- cough
- fever
- and/or difficulty breathing

We advise community members to follow best practices for preventing virus spread:
