

Border Closure: List of Essential Service Providers

Essential Service Providers

The following services are considered essential for the purposes of enforcement of any border closure in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Persons involved in the provision of any of the below listed services will be provided access to the community for the delivery of such services:

Community Services

1. Community services including but not limited to policing and law enforcement, fire and emergency services, paramedics, coroner and pathology services, corrections and court services, licences and permits.
2. Child Protection Workers and any person(s) acting under the authority of child welfare Agencies, pursuant to the *Child, Youth and Family Services Act, 2017*.
3. Gas stations and other fuel suppliers.
4. Security services for residences, businesses and other properties.
5. Vehicle and equipment repair and essential maintenance and vehicle and equipment rental services.
6. Courier, postal, shipping, moving and delivery services.
7. Funeral and related services.
8. Staffing services including providing temporary help.
9. Essential medicinal services.
10. Veterinary services (urgent care only) and other businesses that provide for the health and welfare of animals.

Supply chains

11. Businesses that supply other essential businesses or essential services within the community, with the support, products, supplies, systems, or services, including processing, packaging, warehousing, distribution, delivery, and maintenance necessary to operate.

Food

12. Businesses that primarily sell food, beverages and consumer products necessary to maintain households and businesses including:
 - a. Supermarkets and grocery stores.
 - b. Convenience stores.
 - c. Restaurants (take-out, drive-through and delivery service only).
