(Chippewas of Kettle & Stony Point)


Notice is hereby given that a meeting of the electors of the Kettle & Stony Point First Nation will be held at the Kettle & Stony Point Hillside School gym on Wednesday, September 23, 2020 from the hours of 3:00 pm to 8:00 pm, for the purpose of nominating candidates for the positions of chief and councillors on the Band Council for the Kettle and Stony Point First Nation, for the next ensuing term.

There will be 9 (nine) councillor positions and 1 (one) position for chief to be filled by election process.

The election will be held at the Kettle & Stony Point Hillside School gym, on Friday, November 13, 2020 from the hours of 9:00 am to 8:00 pm (local time). An elector (voter) is any band member of the Kettle & Stony Point First Nation who will be at least 18 years of age on November 13, 2020.

Please note that any voter may nominate candidates by using a mail-in nomination form. You can either deliver or mail-in a written nomination and a completed, signed and witnessed voter declaration form to the electoral officer before the time set for the nomination meeting OR you may nominate candidates at the nomination meeting on September 23, 2020. Nominations not received by the electoral officer before the close of the nomination meeting will be void.

RE: Upcoming Nomination Meeting and Covid-19 Safety Precautions

Electors of Kettle and Stony Point First Nation:

The Nomination Meeting for the purpose of nominating candidates for the general election will be held with the following safety measurements in place:

- Masks are mandatory and to be worn by every person entering the room.
- Pencils will be provided and disposed of afterwards or you may bring your own.
- Sanitizing stations will be in place.
- Pre-screening will be required to every person entering the meeting.
- Limited number of persons in the meeting room at one time.
- Time limit of how long an elector can enter and stay (this is to allow other electors to enter to complete their nominations therefore please bring your list with you).
- Candidates' information (the person you are nominating) is mandatory (phone and address contact information, so please bring that with you).
- The "List of Candidates" will be posted on the First Nation's official website and Face Book the following day.

Any elector can nominate also through the mail-in nomination process by:

1. Completing a Mail-In Voter Declaration form (NOM FORM#1)
2. Completing your Mail-In Nomination Form(s) (NOM FORM#2) – One per candidate
3. Mailing/ delivering the forms to the Electoral Officer before 8:00pm on September 23.

The Nomination Forms can be copied or if requested we can email the forms to you to print, or you can pick more up at the Administration Office. You may also print the forms from the First Nation website.

I welcome and encourage electors to use the Mail-in nomination method. Further updates will be forthcoming to the electors as needed.
